CHARACTER TRAITS

- 1. A trait tells the sort of person or character is and gives an idea about what a character is like.
- 2. A trait **lasts a long time**, often a lifetime.
- 3. An **author may state the trait**. (Ex: He was a *greedy* man.)
- 4. The reader may have to **watch for how characters act or behave**. Give attention to how a character looks, speaks, thinks, feels, behaves towards others, and to what the character says.
